Storm Water Pollution Prevention: It's Up to Us

In the Salt Lake Valley, storm drains flow directly to local creeks and rivers with **NO treatment**. Degradation of storm water is a serious problem for wildlife dependent on our waterways and for the people who live near streams or use them for recreation. Some common sources of contaminants in

- Spilled oil, fuel fluids from vehicles and heavy equipment
- Construction debris

storm runoff include:

- Landscaping runoff containing pesticides or weed killers
- Materials such as used motor oil, antifreeze, paint products that people pour or spill into a street or storm drain.

Murray City has developed a Storm Water Management Program to educate local residents and businesses and to improve the quality of storm water runoff. We hope you will join us, by using the recommended methods (referred to as Best Management Practices) described in this pamphlet.

What Can You Do?

General Practices

- Never use the gutter or storm drain system for disposal of hazardous waste.
- Store toxic products and chemicals indoors, in a shed, storage cabinet or a covered containment area.
- Take unwanted hazardous materials and containers to a hazardous waste disposal facility.
- Develop Standard Operating Procedures on storage, disposal and cleanup of hazardous materials.
- Train all employee's on Standard Operating Procedures to insure pollution prevention.

Automotive

- Take used motor oil and antifreeze to a recycling center or a hazardous waste facility.
- Inspect and maintain vehicles to reduce leakage of fluids.
- Reduce automotive emissions through regular maintenance and by limiting vehicle usage.
- Clean up spills with kitty litter or absorbent material. Dispose of cleanup as hazardous waste.
- Vehicles should be washed at a commercial car wash, or inside with correct drainage to a sewer separator system.
- Do not wash into the Street or Parking Lot!!!
 Do not wash vehicles, tools or equipment in driveways, gutters or drainage ways.
