

Notice is hereby given that the Murray City Municipal Council has a Council seat vacancy for Council District 1 as of November 18, 2022, and will be accepting applications from interested individuals to fill the vacancy. The appointment will be to fill the unexpired term of the vacated office and will last until a newly elected Council Member for Council District 1 is sworn in on January 2, 2024.

The City Council will hold an open and public meeting on **Monday, December 12, 2022, at 5:00 p.m.** in the City Council Chambers, Murray City Center, 5025 South State Street, for purposes of interviewing all applicants. After conducting the interviews, the City Council will vote to select an interim City Council member for Council District 1. After voting, the Council will appoint and have sworn in an interim Municipal Council member for Council District 1 to serve until January 2, 2024.

An applicant must be a registered voter, a resident of Murray City for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the appointment and a resident of District 1. (Additionally, Utah law prohibits a mentally incompetent individual, an individual convicted of a felony, or an individual convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise from holding office until the right to hold elective office is restored.)

By way of introduction the following is a little information about me, and hopefully the value that I would bring to the Council. To be brief much of this will be in a summary format.


- I have been a Murray City resident since 1988.



City Council Vote for Interim City Council Member

Process: Utah Code

Section 20A-1-510 (1)(c)(ii)

“The two individuals having the highest number of votes of the municipal legislative body after a first vote is taken shall appear before the municipal legislative body and the municipal legislative body shall vote again. “

Section 20A-1-510 (1)(c)(iii)

“If neither candidate receives a majority vote of the municipal legislative body at that time, the vacancy shall be filled by lot in the presence of the municipal legislative body.”

City Recorder will call for the first vote.

1. If the vote is 1-1-1-1
A second vote will not be taken and a name will be drawn by lot.
2. If the vote is 2-1-1-0
Eliminate the candidates with no votes.
A lot will be drawn between the two candidates receiving a single vote each, eliminating one person.
A second vote will be taken between the two remaining candidates.
If the second vote results in a tie – draw lot.
3. If the vote is 3-1-0-0
Eliminate the candidates with no votes. Take a second vote between the two remaining candidates. Majority wins. Tie – draw lot.
4. If the vote is 2-2-0-0
Eliminate the candidates with no votes. Take a second vote between the two remaining candidates. Majority wins. Second tie – draw lot.
5. If the vote is 4-0-0-0
Call the winner.



City Council Voting Procedure For Interim Council Member

The City Recorder will call for a vote

- If the vote is **4-0-0-0**:
 - The candidate receiving all four votes is the winner
- If the vote is **1-1-1-1**:
 - The winner will be drawn by lot
- If the vote is **2-2-0-0**:
 - Hold a second vote between the two candidates receiving votes
- If the vote is **3-1-0-0**:
 - Hold a second vote between the two candidates receiving votes
- If the vote is **2-1-1-0**:
 - A lot will be drawn between the two candidates receiving a single vote, eliminating one candidate
 - Hold a second vote between the two remaining candidates

If the second vote results in a tie, the winner will be drawn by lot

WHEREAS, a vacancy occurred on the Murray City Municipal Council for Council District 1 on November 18, 2022; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 20A-1-510(1) of the Utah Code, the City Council must make an appointment of an Interim Council Member for Council District 1 within thirty (30) days after the date of vacancy; and

WHEREAS, on November 21, 2022, the City published notice as provided by law stating the following: (1) there is a vacancy on the Murray City Municipal Council for Council District 1; (2) as a result of the vacancy, the City Council needs to appoint an Interim Council Member for Council District 1; (3) the City Council will accept applications from qualified registered voters of the City to be considered by the City Council for appointment as the Interim Council Member for Council District 1; (4) the deadline for applications was December 12, 2022; (5) the applications must be submitted to Jennifer Kennedy, Council Executive Director at the City Council Office, 5025 South State Street, Murray, Utah; (6) the City Council will interview all interested candidates in a duly noticed open meeting on December 12, 2022; and (5) following interviews in the open meeting, the City Council will appoint an Interim Council Member for Council District 1 to serve as a Council Member for Council District 1 until January 2, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the City Council received on or before December 2, 2022 applications from the following qualified registered voters of the City: _____, _____, _____, _____, and _____; and

WHEREAS, on December 12, 2022, in a duly noticed open meeting, the City Council interviewed: _____, _____, _____, _____, _____, and _____; and

WHEREAS, following the interviews in the open meeting on December 12, 2022, the City Council took a vote on who should be appointed Interim Council Member for Council District 1 among all the candidates; and

WHEREAS, in the meeting on December 12, 2022, _____ received the highest number of votes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wants to appoint _____ as the Interim Council Member for Council District 1, to serve until January 2, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Murray City Council as follows:

1. Pursuant to section 20A-1-510 of the Utah Code and section 2.04.070 of the Murray City Municipal Code, _____ is hereby appointed as Interim Council Member for Council District 1, to serve until a newly elected Council Member is sworn into office on January 2, 2024, with all authority and responsibilities provided to Murray City Council Members by State law and Murray City ordinances and policies.
2. _____, as an Interim Council Member, shall be compensated as provided in Murray City ordinances.
