1. **Consider an Ordinance adopting the Rate of Tax Levies for the Fiscal Year commencing July 1, 2008 and ending June 30, 2009.**

Staff Presentation: Patricia Wilson, Finance Director

Ms. Wilson stated that the City has the forms from the County to calculate the levies; the rate for this past current year for the City has been .001518, and this year, with no Public Hearing to increase that rate, the new rate will be .001422. That is a 6% reduction over the last year for the City. The Library's rate for this past current year was .000368, and this year it will be .000345, which is also a 6% decrease. Once approved, the City will send the paperwork to the County.

2. **Consider a Resolution approving an amendment to an interlocal cooperation agreement between the City and Salt Lake County, Utah State Department of Public Safety, Draper City, Taylorsville City, Midvale City, Utah State Motor Vehicle Division, Sandy City, Salt Lake City, South Jordan City, City of West Jordan, West Valley City, Granite School District, Salt Lake Airport Police, City of South Salt Lake, Tooele City, United States Marshal for Utah, Utah State Department of Corrections, Utah State Department of Natural Resources, and the Town of Ata (the “parties”) for multi-jurisdictional mutual aid for sheriff and police services to include the Utah Transit Authority and Cottonwood Heights as parties.**

Staff Presentation: Chief Fondaco

Chief Fondaco explained that this was previously approved through the Council, and this Resolution is adding Cottonwood Heights and the UTA Police Department, which are new since it was approved. It will also go before the other Cities and their Councils, and he hopes that they other Cities do not make a lot of amendments, or else it will need to be brought before the Council again. It was brought before the Councils about a year and a half ago, and everyone made their changes at that time, this is only to add the two cities to the agreement.
