Getting there and Getting Around

1. Entrances, Parking & Pathways
 - a. The Murray City Museum is located inside Murray City Hall, southeast end. Entrances to City Hall are both on the east and west side of the building.
 - b. There are two parking lots with paved sidewalk access to the museum. Each is located about 50 feet from the museum entrance.
2. Public Transit
 - a. There are many bus stops near Murray City Hall. For the closest on your route, use the UTA trip planner found at [Plan Your Trip](#).
3. Visitors with Limited Mobility
 - a. Entry to the museum via stairs is located at the museum front entrance (southeast end of City Hall). Entry to the museum via ramp is located at the northeast end of Murray City Hall.
 - b. The Museum is on the first floor of City Hall.
 - c. A tour of the museum requires brief periods of movement and standing. Seating is provided upon request.
 - d. When available, school tours include may include a visit to the Mayor's Office which is located on the second floor of City Hall. The second floor is accessible via stairs or elevator.
4. Restrooms
 - a. Restrooms are available throughout City Hall. An accessible, barrier-free restroom is located very close outside of the museum door.

5. Sensory Accessibility

- a. The museum exhibits are lit by overhead lights that are focused on the objects. There is no music planning in the museum, but there are a few listening stations throughout the museum space that play recordings of people talking. Visitors are encouraged to bring their own appropriate sensory soothing tools. An appropriate sensory tool would be one that does not cause harm to other patrons, the museum, or the objects on display.

6. Service Animals

- a. Service animals that are trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability are welcome in the museum. Non-service animals, or pets whose function is to provide emotional support and comfort are not permitted.
- b. In order to bring a service animal into the Murray Museum, the animal must be harnessed, leashed or tethered, unless the device interferes with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents the use of the harness.
- c. A water bowl for service animals can be provided upon request.

Accommodations Request Policies

1. Requests should be made email or phone. Please allow our staff to review the request for 24-48 hours before a response is expected.
2. Any accommodation requests that are not readily available should be made at least 2 weeks prior to the visit.
3. When we are not able to meet accommodation requests, we will communicate that deficiency honestly and respectfully. We will also make note of each request for future accessibility planning. We respect the privacy of our guests and only share necessary information with staff as needed.
